Educational Visits and Residentials

Educational offsite visits happen throughout the year as part of all areas of the curriculum, subject frameworks highlight offsite opportunities each term. These opportunities are planned and organised by each Class Teacher and are approved by our educational visits coordinator and Headteacher, through Hampshire's educational visits approval system, EVOLVE.

Permissions are sent via the EVOLVE approval system to Parents and Carers and provide details and costs of the visits.

All pupils in KS3 have access to outdoor education each year, either a day visit or a 2-day residential at the Hampshire centre, Runways End.

Our KS4 pupils undertake the Duke of Edinburgh award which consist of an offsite expedition of either 1 or 2 night expeditions each year. Many of our pupils have never experienced the great outdoors and, learning in a different environment gives the opportunity to develop resilience, independence skills, teamwork and practical survival skills. The outdoor, physical elements also boosts mental health. These residential opportunities, for many pupils, is the first time they have ever stayed away from home. This builds confidence, allows relationships to strengthen and gives pupils opportunities to take part in challenging activities such as navigation, climbing, low rope obstacles and team challenges. Pupils experience real success and are proud of their accomplishments.
