What they look like at Hollywater School?

Our Celebration assemblies take place on Friday mornings. This is an opportunity to come together as a whole school and celebrate the small steps that have been achieved by specific pupils through Headteacher certificates and Star of the Week certificates.

- Relate them to the interests and needs of the school
- Aim to be inclusive all students should gain something from the experience
- Give opportunities for students to reflect on what was presented through discussion and in silence
- Involve the students by asking lots of questions and eliciting their views and ideas.
