Red class

In Red Class this month, we continued our exploration of World War 2. We shared some of our own family stories about what relatives had done in World War 2. This made us proud. We talked about how it would feel to be separated from our families. We wrote a letter to a relative who we imagined was away at war, and told them how this made us feel.
